The Victorian Government recently ceased fee collections for entry to all National Parks in Victoria. As a result there is no longer any need for the Club to mail out car park passes to members.

portsea IRONMAN 2010/11

The Kellogg's Nutri-Grain Surf Ironman Series, Ironwoman Series and Legends Series feature the country's best surf life saving athletes competing in the most gruelling ocean based competition on the planet....and it is coming to PORTSEA!!!

The 2010/11 series will be fought out over five rounds at iconic Australian beaches including Currumbin (November 21), Bondi (December 3), Coolum (December 19), Portsea (January 2) and Noosa Heads (January 9).

Both the Kellogg's Nutri-Grain Ironman Series and the Ironwoman Series will feature 20 athletes each, while the Legends Series will pit teams of three wily veterans against each other for a chance to relive past glories.

Names like **Shannon** and **Caine Eckstein**, **Zane Holmes**, **Ky Hurst** and **Hugh Dougherty** will take on up-and-comers **Ali Day**, **Matt Poole** and **Mitch Miller** in the Ironman, while in the Ironwoman **Alicia Marriott** will try and defend her crown against **Liz Plummers**, the **Hancock sisters Courtney** and **Bonnie**, world champ **Kristyl Smith** and Victoria's own **Harriett Brown**.

All five races will feature popular formats that test endurance, power, skill and speed and be broadcast live on Network Ten and One HD as part of more than 40 hours of television coverage.

The return to the crowd pleasing old formats and indeed to Portsea as a venue was the brainchild of one of the Legends Series

contestants, former superstar **Guy Leech** who is the new Series' Director.

"I had some great times at Portsea and some classic battles with the likes of **Trevor Hendy** and when I started working on putting this series together a race at Portsea was on top of the list," **Leech** said.

"The obvious reason is the massive surf that often pumps in there and then there is the huge crowds that just go mad for this type of racing.

"I have spoken to a lot of the competitors and while some of them are a bit nervous by Portsea's reputation they are all excited for the challenge."

All the action kicks off December 2nd at 9am and will run through until 5pm.

boomer interview IAN CAMPBELL

Ian Campbell has seen PSLSC through some of the highest, and lowest, times in the club's history. He was there when a sandbar collapsed and 100 swimmers were rescued at one tumultuous time. He was there when a storm literally lifted the roof of the clubhouse and brought the club to its knees, only to be saved by 'tin rattling' and determination.

Ian shares his memories and message in this brilliant self-penned Boomer Interview.

HOW DID YOU COME TO JOIN PORTSEA?

It was 1980, I had completed a mature age degree at Monash and had been in my first IT job for a couple of years where I met **Simon Knight** and we got to talking about surfing, boating, all the water stuff and it turned out he was a clubbie from Portsea. I had been an active member at Elwood 10 years earlier but drifted away into surfing and scuba diving.

Simon encouraged me to get involved again so I started my Bronze parttime at Mordialloc after work. The squad was run by **Gerry Reardon**, **Jenny Evans** and **John Adams** in those days. That's where I met **Jeff Hunt**, we share the same birth date and we've been mates since.

YOU HAVE BEEN THE SECRETARY OF PORTSEA FOR 26 YEARS, WHAT GOT YOU INTERESTED AND WHY DID YOU SERVE FOR SO LONG?

Brian Eva had recently become secretary and needed a hand with memberships processing so I ran for the position of registrar and loaded the membership list into a database. That was the start of the computerisation of the clubs administration.

Brian moved into the position of President in 1984 and I took over as Secretary. I served

as Secretary to Brian from '84 to '93, then **Cameron Hunter** from '93 to '04 then **Simon Wilson** from 2005 to date.

Tim Hart has been Treasurer on the committee with me since '96. It has been a great experience working with these gentlemen. We provided a stable senior management presence with a sound financial base to allow the club captains and their teams to focus on delivery of life saving services.

THE YEARS OF THE UNCLE TOBY'S IRON MAN SERIES WERE A HIGH POINT IN THE RECENT HISTORY OF THE CLUB. WHAT ARE YOUR RECOLLECTIONS?

The club had tried for years to get a Victorian carnival at Portsea without success. We also tried to get National Council to run a leg of the Kelloggs Iron Man Series at Portsea also without success.

I was driving to work one morning in November '89 when I heard a news report on the radio announcing that Uncle Toby's was to stage a rebel Iron Man series in opposition to Kelloggs. I called **Tim Hart** to suggest we approach Uncle Toby's to offer Portsea as the venue for the Victorian event. Tim agreed and by the end of the day I had met with **Graham Hannah** from IMG (the event management) and we had a deal!

For the next two months Portsea and some of our senior members were put under intense pressure by Surf Life Saving Australia to pull out of the deal but we resisted and January on Sunday 21st January 1990 **Grant Kenny**, **Trevor Hendy**,

Guy Leech and 20 other Ironmen hit the Portsea surf for one of the greatest days of surf competition ever witnessed in Australia. Our association with IMG and Uncle Toby's was to last for 12 years and put Portsea firmly on the life saving map.

THE CLUBHOUSE WAS SEVERELY DAMAGED IN 1984 IN A HUGE STORM. WHAT WAS YOUR INVOLVEMENT IN THE RECOVERY FROM THIS?

The roof of the club and the first storey brickwork was lifted by the wind then dropped back into place. It didn't look bad but it was a disaster. The club was uninhabitable for almost 2 seasons.

These were tough times for the club. We had no money and the rebuild was going nowhere. I gathered a bunch of the older members, **Brian (Dairy Legs) Eva**, **Michael (Harpo) Parkes**, **Simon (The Guv) Knight**, **Jeff Hunt**, **Dick (Tricky) Fisher**, **Gus Milligan** and **Phil Beattie** and we formed the Restore Portsea Group. We started writing letters to suppliers of building materials with some success but we still needed cash to pay tradesmen.

The club negotiated a bank loan secured by four club members, we rattled cans ever week on Dandenong Road and met with Victorian MLA and Sports Minister **Neil (Nipper) Trezise** who agreed to a grant of \$20,000 and the rebuilding commenced.

Our builder, **John Maskell** and his assistant and club member **Michael Parkes** lived and worked in the derelict clubhouse for 12 months as we restored it to the standard we see now. We couldn't have achieved this without the regular working bees attended by many of our members. Who can forget the chopper lift of materials; telegraph poles coming down the cliff on the shoulders of 20 clubbies or the



brick chute down the cliff. There was no Work Safety in those days!!!

Right at the end of the restoration we just plain ran out of money! Some of our Family Members banded together and formed The Portsea Foundation to raise funds to get us to

completion. The Foundation is a major supporter of the clubs major project works. It was great working with some of Melbourne leading business and sporting personalities to secure the clubs future.

IS THERE A SECOND GENERATION OF CAMPBELL'S IN THE CLUB?

My wife **Lisa Campbell** has been a wonderful support during the 30 years of our involvement and we have many good friends from the club. Our children, **Eliza** and **Rory** did their Bronze at the famed Portsea Bronze Camp; **Rory** patrols with me in The Legends while after two seasons at Portsea **Eliza** moved to Woolamai to compete in surf boats. Both are excellent swimmers and enjoyed the tough conditions we regularly experience where the Blood and the Surf mix.

WHAT DOES COMPETITION MEAN TO YOU?

It is a small but very enjoyable part of life saving. I have completed at most Victorian Masters Titles since the 1987 Fairhaven titles where I started with **Simon Knight** and **Dave Law**. Beach Flags is my passion and between me, **Simon Knight** and **Rowan Cameron**, Portsea has done a fair job of dominating our age groups for years. IRB's was also great fun. Something to do over winter in five degree sunless windy days with two wetsuits and a slicker and still freezing to death... Winning a couple of fully equipped IRB's during the 80's made up for the cold (almost)!!

IN 30 YEARS OF ACTIVE SERVICE YOU MUST HAVE SEEN A LOT OF ACTION WHILE ON PATROL. WHAT STANDS OUT?

The mass rescue when the Legends Patrol rescued over 100 swimmers from the surf after a sandbar collapsed was an example of teamwork and leadership that saved so many lives.



The incident that impacted on me most occurred on the last patrol of season 1999 and on a shocking Portsea southerly day.

We sighted a swimmer on the west of Huey's reef struggling in the run-out. I donned the tube and headed out. I got to him just as this huge wave was about to drop on us... I grabbed

his arm, wrapped my legs around him and hung on, we really got smashed!! We made it to the shallows and the patrol picked him up and took him to the shelter. He was barely conscious so we called the ambulance and off to Rosebud hospital he went where he spent four days under observation.

He returned to the beach to thank us on the first patrol of the next season but his young son refused to come onto the beach as the memory of his father's near-drowning was still too frightening.

YOU RETIRED FROM THE ROLE OF SECRETARY AT THE 2010 AGM. WHAT DO YOU HAVE PLANNED?

It was a small AGM, they are all small these days, but the members present were the stalwarts we have come to depend on. **Tim Hart** made a speech and the club presented me with a beautiful Georg Jensen carafe as a momentum of my time on committee.

I intend to continue to assist in the running of the web site as an interest. I also intend to continue patrolling with The Legends. It feels a bit strange to stand-down after such a long and enjoyable time serving on the committee and I know I will miss it for a while.

WHAT IS YOUR MESSAGE FOR THE FUTURE LIFESAVERS AT PORTSEA?

You must be dependable. Attending your rostered patrols is the single most important thing you can do as a lifesaver. When you are on the beach wear the uniform (as daggy as it may be) with pride. Always keep your eyes on the swimmers; they venture into the water knowing there is a patrol on duty to keep them safe; don't let them down. B

tips from the MASTERS...

1. Feeling happy and healthy will help you get the most out of summer, so make sure you hit the pool and the track in the lead up.
2. When you buy your Portsea bathers for the season, make sure you get out a big thick permanent marker and put your name as big and as legible as you can.
3. Don't miss out on those beautiful early morning, or evening paddles with your friends. Especially when the waves are crisp and rolling in.
4. Make sure you see at least one stunning sunset over the summer on the surf club deck; a cold drink in hand is essential.
5. As you dive under a big, crashing Portsea wave, grab on to the sand on the bottom, and take a second to think how awesome it is to have such an incredible beach to play on!

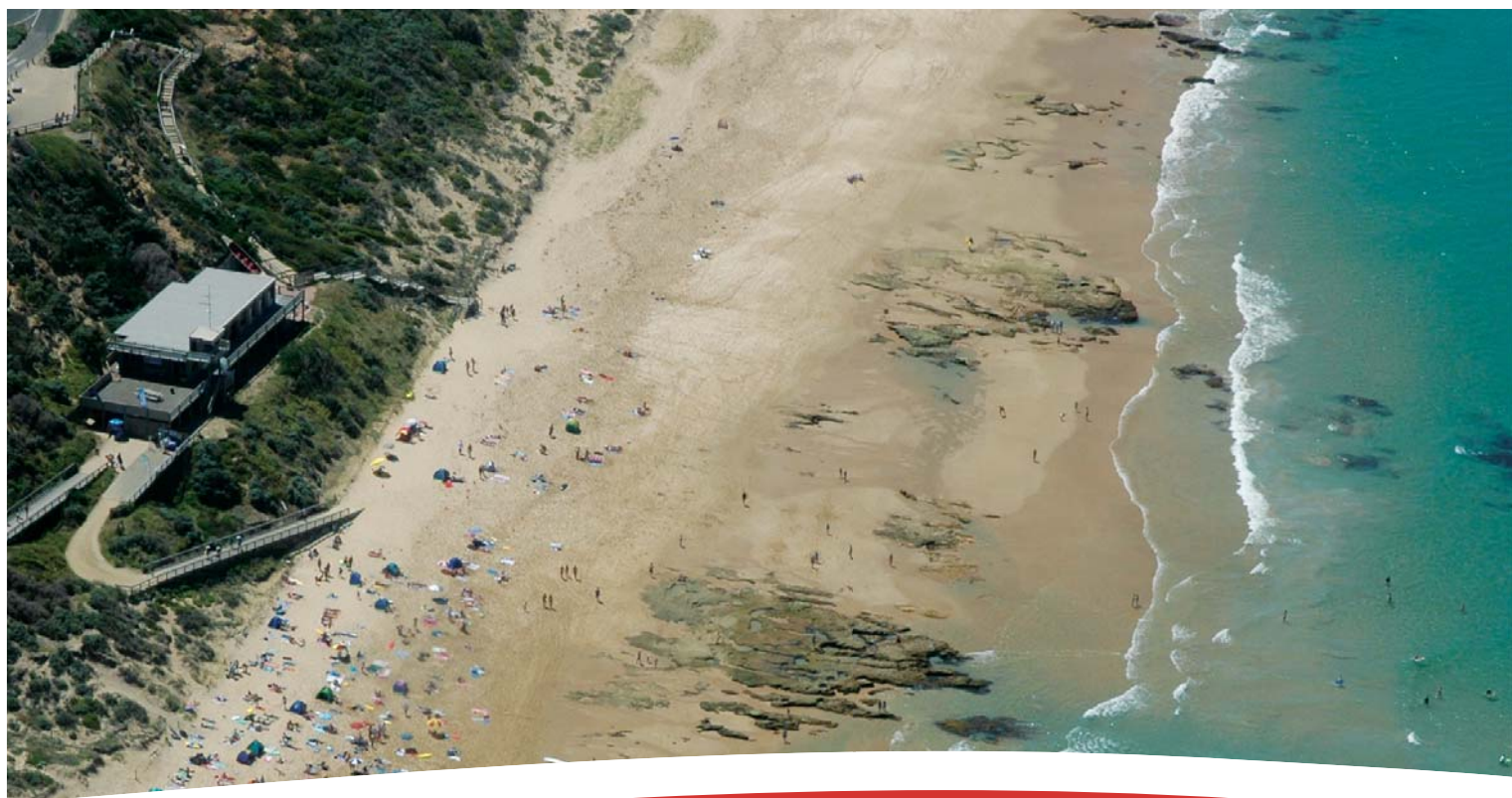
