Record 1,400 Compete in MTR HONG KONG Race Walking 2009 Stepping Up Support for Better Health

Ten top race walkers from across the Asia-Pacific, around 40 Hong Kong community leaders, over 40 Corporate Teams, more than a thousand walkers from all walks of life, and hundreds of cheering fans took part in MTR HONG KONG Race Walking 2009 today (19 April 2009) to promote healthy living.

The event was organised by the Hong Kong Amateur Athletic Association in conjunction with the MTR Corporation for the fifth consecutive year, and raised more than HK\$1 million for the Hospital Authority Health InfoWorld to promote good health.

Ms Eva Cheng, Secretary for Transport and Housing, was the Guest of Honour at the event. "Combining sports, health, fun and charity, this highly enjoyable sporting event brings great health benefits to every walker," said Ms Cheng. "The competition is made more meaningful as it raises money for a good cause, while providing opportunity to promote friendship and team spirit."

"With the economy a concern for many people in Hong Kong, we should not forget to maintain good work-life balance and a healthy lifestyle," said Mrs Rita Lau, Secretary for Commerce and Economic Development, who sounded the starting horn for the MTR Chairman's Invitational race. "Race Walking is a simple and convenient exercise, the perfect choice for those with little time to spare."

Led by Dr Raymond K F Ch'ien, Chairman of the MTR Corporation, around 40 business and community leaders participated in the friendly MTR Chairman's Invitational race. Renowned artistes and athletes Ms Olivia Cheng and Mr Alex Fong once again served as MTR HONG KONG Race Walking Ambassadors. Both joined the MTR Chairman in the Invitational race.

A record-high of over 1,400 race walkers participated in 15 race categories. "It is so encouraging to see more and more people each year coming out to MTR HONG KONG Race Walking, reflecting the growing consciousness among Hong Kong people to the importance of staying fit to maintain healthy bodies and minds," said Dr Ch'ien. "We are pleased that the MTR Corporation is able to do its part in promoting healthier lifestyles both through this event and in raising funds for health education."







Among the athletes participating this year were top-calibre race walkers from Australia, China, Japan, Malaysia and Singapore who vied for the Men's and Women's Elite Champion trophies.

"The internationalisation of MTR HONG KONG Race Walking 2009 provides an excellent backdrop for the East Asian Games scheduled to open in Hong Kong in December. These will be the first and largest multi-national, multi-sport games to be held in Hong Kong's history, putting our city on the map in international sporting competition," said Mr Alex Moh, President of the Hong Kong Amateur Athletic Association.
