## Across the desk of the President:

Well another year is nearly coming to a close and it is at this time we start preparing for the year to come – **SO** what are your plans for 2018? How can the club help you in reaching your goals – give it some thought, and drop a note to the Secretary at your earliest, and/or talk to a committee member. A goal session will be held on Thursday **11<sup>th</sup> January 2018** to assist members.

The club calendar for the first 3 months has now been distributed and on the website. Most events are in Archers Diary and we would like to encourage as many members to register on line at home before coming to the club as possible, this will assist in setting up sufficient targets for the day.

Registrations open at 8.15 and close at 8.45 – with shooting commencing @ 9.00am both days.

**Ground Crew:** Should arrive about 8.00 am to set out the round for the day

- Secure the rope on the shooting line, then run two tape measures down each side of the field
- Mark out the field as per shooting calendar
- Make sure you take out enough flags & hammers

**IT Personnel:** Should arrive about 8.00 am and undertake the following:

- Put out the desk, including the registration book / target sign on sheet
- Set up the Wi-Fi system, making sure that it is plugged in and connected
- Arrange the computer so that members can register into the event, assist if required

If you are unable to attend on your nominated day, please let either the President and/or Secretary know (*preferably prior to the day, as emails are not always checked daily*)

**Members:** On arrival please sign the registration book / allocate yourself to a target, then with others on that target proceed to put your target butt onto the shooting field. If asked please assist some of the younger ones who are unable to move the targets. This should be completed before any equipment is set up.

- As the Ground Crew take a guess on what targets are needed, between 8.45 & 9.00 targets may need to be changed, so that there are no large gaps in between distances being shot. This is called team work to achieve quickly.
- Ensure all butts are secured
- Please ensure that when you are entering yourself into Archers Diary that you are selecting the correct equipment and age group. Especially those of you who are going up an age group 1<sup>st</sup> January 2018.

- Just prior to shooting, please proceed to enter members on your target into archers diary – score the round, however, before leaving for the day, please ensure that your phone has synced the scores into archers diary, to save disappointment and members missing out on registering a score.
- At the completion of the shoot, all archers should assist in returning their target butts/target faces & flags etc., to the club room in a tidy manner.

With the **Warringah Open** being the first tournament on the ASNSW Calendar (**3<sup>rd</sup> February**), entries are now open, and it would be great if Warringah Archers could field a full Recurve Team / Compound Team and Women's team. There is a special rate for club members, so please take advantage of this event, as space is limited, it will be first in best dressed - so start practicing 40m on an 80cm face

The club will also be hosting the **1<sup>st</sup> of ASNSW Grand Prix** series on the **18<sup>th</sup> February**. Ranking round plus Round Robin Matchplay, further details will be out shortly.

ArcheryNSW is having an Ordinary General Meeting on the 30<sup>th</sup> January, therefore, if there is anything that you would like your club delegate to bring up to this meeting, let one of your committee members know.

At the end of 2017 we saw the **President / Secretary & Treasurers Team** finish their 3 month battle of the archers, and it was a very close finish, with the **Treasurers Target Troopers taking out the December handicap (oh!),** with a handicap score of 10773 what can I say, well done to everyone that competed, as President it was exciting to see everyone joining in. A full summary for the teams will be posted later, but December results were:

**3<sup>rd</sup> place - Secretary's Sharp Shooters:** Off the bow Score of 5521, with a handicap score of 8022.

Thanks to all of those who competed and we will ensure the event is scheduled for 2018, it was great to see 30-40 shooters competing at these events.


## WOMENS INTRODUCTION to ARCHERY

This new section can help us all understand current scenarios from a Judges perspective and grow knowledge on Rules of our sport. We will present an example scenario or rules in each Club newsletter going forward. So when reading, have a think about how they are relevant to you, what you have seen, and ever asked yourself, what would I do?

### What Would You Do? - Electronic Devices:

**Scenario:** Archers at a target event are using their mobile phones to record scores electronically on Archers Diary. However, they begin to use the phone to take 'selfies' of themselves and their target results each end. Soon they are photographing other competitors and the judges. At what point do you speak to these competitors and what do you say about their use of mobile phone technology?

**Judges View:** Electronic devices in front of the waiting line are only to be used for scoring using the Archers Diary app. Should a judge see archers using their phones for any other purpose, they must be asked to stop immediately. Some archers will test judges to see how much they can get away with and soon you could have more than one instance to deal with. On the other hand, when the event is over and scoring done, there is nothing wrong with an archer taking a photo of his fellow competitors at the target butt and this is allowed under Archery Australia's policy on Photography (1027).

\*\* Archery Australia Policy (June17) indicated the rule of 'No electronic communication devices in front of the shooting line' was to prevent athlete communications for coaching. AA Board has agreed Policy to allow [electronic devices for scoring only](#). i.e. cannot be used for communication - calls, social media, text email etc.
