HOW MANY TIMES HAVE THE RECORDERS SAID THIS?

if you are shooting with someone who is completing the paper score sheet (particularly new archers) please do help them to ensure that the information that identifies the archers (ie. name/number/bow type/ gender/class, round and date) are completed.

It's important that paper scoresheets correctly classify each shooter otherwise they cannot be recognised, and the scoresheet may be discarded. **This applies to all archers!!**
