

ARROW CONSTRUCTION

The replacement of the club's aluminium arrows with carbon arrows is underway. It may take a while but when finished it should make the matching bow poundage and length with arrow spine, simpler and faster for junior and senior coaches.



Thank you to **Lance Holmes**, who has been helping with the arrow construction and to Archery Supplies for providing the shafts and points at a reduced cost.

HEAT SHRINK TRIAL

To prevent bow strings from falling off the unstrung bows kept in the Equipment Room we are heat shrinking the bottom loop of each bow string to its string limb groove. So far, the trial has been promising. Thank you to **Alan Chapple** for the suggestion.
