

### 2022 City of Adelaide (an AA registered tournament) was shot on Sunday, 6 February

A large field of 35 archers participated, which was a big increase on the 20 archers who shot the event in 2021. Participants from Southern Vales Archery Club, Barossa Archery Club, Eden Field Archers, Great Southern Archers, and Hills Archers were joined by 22 AAC members. Bow type numbers included 4 long bow, 17 recurve and 14 compound archers.

The event was organized by AAC **Tournament Director Graham Winston** and scrutinised by AA **accredited Judges Jeff Nicoll and Chris Lech**, with Chris fulfilling the role of Director of Shooting. The TD and judges were warmly applauded by the appreciative competitors at the event's conclusion.








For the second year in a row **Christine Favre** finished top of the Women's Recurve with a score of 723, followed by the rapidly improving **Anabelle Conboy** (676) and **Mariagrazia Panetta** (664). The Men's Recurve was a close fought event with winner **Andrew Fores'** (SVAC) score of 801 just 3 points above **Jean-Michel Favre** (798 – and ruing a miss in the second end of the day) and 5 points above third placed **Stephen Hann** (796) who shot recurve instead of compound this year. Special mention must go to **Chris de Mello** who shot a "Yellow de Mello" from 50m!

Ivy Yu (429), who only shot 60m for the first time the day before the event, won the Women's Longbow from 2021 winner Naomi Johnson. In the Men's Longbow Alan Chapple (568) shot consistently to win the event again in 2022, beating Dr Steve Sykes who finished second.

Club President **Daniel Caon** presented the coveted engraved crystal "City of Adelaide" trophies to the six winners at the end of proceedings.

#### FROM THE PRESIDENT, DANIEL CAON

Our most recent grant application for the club rooms extension was rejected, so we requested feedback, which is as follows:

This was the largest ever grant scheme they had processed, with over 300 applications.

We have a single sport facility, so it was given a lower score – it goes to the participation rate.

The "quality infrastructure" data was good i.e. our plans and the business case were appreciated.

It was noted that the building quote and development approval had lapsed.

The building quote was not itemised as well as they would like. They suggested more photos of the current facility be added, showing the poor state of the building so that the need for the upgrade would be more memorable.

They suggested using the OSR (Office of Sport and Recreation) staff for a review of the application, say 3-4 weeks before submission, to get some advice.

The next round will open in May/June with successful offers being made in October, 2022.

**Paul Bergen** recently volunteered for the position of Assistant Equipment Officer. He may require assistance in that role in the near future, so a call for help may come.



### FROM THE TOURNAMENT DIRECTOR, GRAHAM WINSTON

Graham is working with an on-line trophy company, and with the Junior Co-ordinator, **Andy Stanford**, to introduce a new style of tournament trophy. It will be like the City of Adelaide trophies (shown left), which is etched glass with our logo. This will reduce the annual cost for the juniors from \$1500+ to around \$400. Also, he hopes to change the adult trophies for new winners, to drop the cost from \$28 to \$16 each, saving another \$300. The boards and shields/name tags for previous winners would be retained.

(It was pointed out at the club meeting that a special logo has always been used for the City of Adelaide. This can be used next year instead of the club
